| <b>American Arborvitae</b> | Native evergreen, hardy, grows well in a variety of soils, excellent for screens, hedges, windbreak   | 12-18"           | 10 for \$19                        |                    |      |
| <b>American Elderberry</b> | Native shrub that features fragrant white flowers and bluish-black berries. Great food source for wildlife; berries can be harvest by early fall and make excellent jelly, preserves, pie, & wine; mature height 5-12 feet  | 12-18"           | 5 for \$10                         |                    |      |
| <b>American Plum</b>       | Native, reaches a mature height of about 20 feet; fruit provides food for birds with fruit, twigs, and leaves eaten by deer; as a windbreak, ideally planted with about eight feet between each trunk; will spread quickly, filling out the space and growing upwards while improving the soil beneath. | 6-12"            | 5 for \$12                         |                    |      |
| <b>Black Spruce</b>        | Evergreen, grows well in most soil type, often known as "bog or swamp spruce", needles are deep blue green and non-prickly. Can grow into a dense habitat making it desirable for windbreaks  | 6-12"            | 10 for \$19                        |                    |      |
| <b>Buttonbush</b>          | Native to the Eastern United States that will thrive in wet and low lying areas. Blooms July and August with cream colored flowers that develop into nutlet type fruits, remaining on into the winter. | <b>Eastern White Pine</b>  | Native evergreen, hardy pine, windbreaks, Christmas trees; long, soft needles, grows 75-100 feet in height, can tolerate poorer soils   | 10-16"           | 10 for \$19                        |                    |      |
| <b>Paw Paw</b>             | Native, beautiful tree that grows to 15-20 ft. Does well in moist to well drained soils & in shade to full sun. Purple flowers in spring, green leaves & edible fruit in summer, golden leaves in fall  | 6-12"            | 5 for \$12                         |                    |      |
| <b>Scarlet Maple</b>       | Native tree growing to 50 to 60 feet, developing a round head of green leaves with silver under-color. Silver-gray bark, with leaves turning brilliant crimson in Fall. | <b>Silky Dogwood</b>       | Shrub producing good wildlife cover and feed for birds. Berries produced are a pale blue with foliage turning a deep red in the Fall.   | 12-18"           | 5 for \$10                         |                    |      |
