On or about, but not before, March 19, 2026, the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners will submit a request to the State of Ohio for the release of Federal funds under Section 104 (g) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended; Section 288 of Title II of the Cranston Gonzales National Affordable Housing Act (NAHA), as amended; and/or Title IV of the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act, as amended; to be used for the following project(s):

Water Facilities, City of Girard Fire Hydrant Replacement Project
Public Facility Imp. & Professional Fees

PY2025 CDBG Allocation Program (\$165,000) & Revolving Loan Fund (\$10,000)

Funds will be utilized to pay for professional fees and construction related to the removal and replacement of 11 fire hydrants that serve LMI areas throughout the City of Girard.

Single-Year Project, City of Girard, CE Subject to Section 58.5, Subsequently Exempt, \$175,000

Street Improvements, Donley Road Improvements Project
Public Facility Improvements, PY2025 CDBG Allocation

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners by U.S. mail or email at the addresses above. All comments received before March 19, 2026, will be considered by the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The Board of Trumbull County Commissioners certifies to the State of Ohio that Tony Bernard in his capacity as President, Board of Trumbull County Commissioners consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The State of Ohio's approval of the

certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

The State of Ohio will accept objections to its release of funds and the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners; (b) the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the State of Ohio; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to Ohio Department of Development, Office of Community Development at OCD@development.ohio.gov. Potential objectors should contact the State of Ohio to verify the actual last day of the objection period.

<p>Activity Description and Outcomes:</p> <p>The proposed Donley Rd Street Reconstruction project involves stabilization and street reconstruction, including full-depth reclamation, of an approximately 6,531-foot-long section of Countyline Donley Road between Girdle Road and State Route 534 in Mesopotamia Township, Trumbull County, Ohio. The project area includes the extent of roadway right-of-way (ROW), which is approximately thirty (30) feet from the road’s centerline in either direction; however, ground disturbance will be limited to the existing roadway’s footprint. This project is necessary to alleviate the critical condition of the roadway, which has not been improved in over 20 years (see attached pictures). In addition to being in critical condition, Countyline Donley Rd. poorly drains, which causes dangerous conditions with standing water and icing. The completion of the project will have a definite positive impact by improving the Pavement Condition Rating (PCR) from critical to excellent condition and will also create a safe travel route for emergency and local government personnel, Amish travelers, children, or school buses and the general public. The project will also correct the profile of the road, which will improve the drainage, thereby extending the useful life of the road and making for much safer travel during the winter.</p>





Trumbull County, on behalf of the Ohio Department of Development and the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, is in the process of performing an environmental review pursuant to Statutes, Executive Orders and Regulations set forth under 24 CFR Part 58 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Residential Public Infrastructure Grant (RPIG) Program funding the Donley Road Street Improvements Project in Mesopotamia Township. The project is being constructed in accordance with the County's General Plan for Street Improvements.

We would like to request your review and comments related to any potential adverse or beneficial environmental impacts of the proposed Countyline Donley Rd. (County Highway 302), Street Improvements Project. Enclosed please find a location/service area map and scope of work breakdown of the proposed Street Improvements Project. A copy of this letter and OHPO's response will be placed in the environmental review record for the proposed project. Below is a description of the project scope for your reference.

Countyline Donley Rd. (County Highway 302), Street Improvements Project– Mesopotamia Township:

Work includes stabilization and street reconstruction including full depth reclamation. This section of Countyline Donley Rd. measures 6,531 feet in length and averages 19 feet in width. This project has a useful life of 15 years. The Donley Road Street Improvements Project service area is located within Census Tract 9305 Block Group 1. The service area boundaries were determined based on the project design parameters which include the individual residents and owners of the 20 residences and 6 farms located along the section of Countyline Donley Road between Girdle Road and State Route 534.

This letter is in response to the correspondence received on November 5, and 13, 2025, regarding the proposed Countyline Donley Rod Street Improvements Project located in Mesopotamia Township, Trumbull County, Ohio. We appreciate the opportunity to comment on this project. The comments of the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) are made in accordance with the provisions of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (54 U.S.C. 306108 [36 CFR 800]).

The proposed project involves stabilization and street reconstruction, including full-depth reclamation, of an approximately 6,531-foot-long section of Countyline Donley Road between Girdle Road and State Route 534 in Mesopotamia Township, Trumbull County, Ohio. Per the submission and additional information provided on November 13, 2025, the Area of Potential Effect (APE) should be considered the extent of roadway right-of-way (ROW), which is approximately thirty (30) feet from the road's centerline in either direction; however, ground disturbance will likely be limited to the existing roadway's footprint.

According to our records, the eastern segment of the APE has been previously professionally surveyed; however, this survey did not identify any archaeological sites, historic properties, or historic districts within the APE. Furthermore, there were no historic properties, districts, or previously recorded archaeological sites documented within or adjacent to the remainder of the APE. Due to prior disturbance from roadway and utility construction, this project has little to no potential to impact intact archaeological deposits. Based on this information, it is the SHPO's opinion that the project, as proposed, will have **no effect on historic properties**. No further coordination is required for this project unless the scope of work changes or archaeological remains are discovered during the course of the project. 





The Ohio EPA received your request dated January 9, 2026, to review and comment on the above referenced project. Based on the pictures provided, we concur that the project will alleviate the poor condition of the roadway.

If this project disturbs one or more acres of ground, then a construction stormwater discharge permit will be required.

For projects involving construction or placement of fill in a stream or wetland, the applicant shall contact the appropriate district of U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for a determination regarding potential impacts to waters of the state as well as the requirements for obtaining, if necessary, certification. Thank you for discussing your project, LRB-2026-00053, “Trumbull County - Donley Street Improvements”, located along Donley Street between Girdle Road and State Route 534 in Mesopotamia Township, Trumbull County, Ohio. Based on the materials you submitted and our discussion today, the proposed work will only occur on the surface of the existing roadway and will include reconstruction of the road surface. All work will be confined to the existing road surface footprint and will not affect more than the top six inches of road surface. There will be no impacts or changes to the stream crossing of Donley Road at Grapevine Creek other than resurfacing the roadway. The structure itself will not be impacted. Therefore, because the project is restricted to only the existing road surface, there are no anticipated impacts to aquatic resources from the proposed activity.

Please note for future projects that the National Wetland Inventory (NWI) maps are a great resource for locating aquatic resources; however, these maps do not always entirely reflect on-site conditions, especially for smaller wetlands. A wetland delineation is needed to define aquatic resources on-site for projects that are not restricted to an existing road surface footprint.

Good afternoon. Upon your request, this office reviewed the letter and accompanying materials provided for the Donley Rd Street Improvements Project.

Utilizing the National Wetland Inventory Mapper tool, there are sensitive areas identified in the proposed project area. The mapper tool, however, does not replace a more comprehensive assessment considered to be a determination and/or delineation. Upon further discussion with you, the scope of the project was clarified to ensure that the work would not impact the affiliated waterway and/or wetland.

General recommendations are below:

- A storm water pollution prevention plan is not needed for this project, however, any ground disturbance should be addressed through best management practices typically utilized within erosion and sediment control (ESC) to prevent damage or degradation of local waterways including wetlands and/or adjacent property.
- Work should be performed in accordance with the Rainwater and Land Development Manual, Ohio's Standards for Stormwater Management, Land Development and Urban Stream Protection, 2006.
- Any necessary local, state, and/or federal permits should be obtained prior to the start of the project.



PROXIMITY TO COASTAL MANAGEMENT ZONE AREAS






