Dear Attorney Hoying:

Previously, I have written the Board two letters, on August 12, 2021 and October 1, 2003, with attachments stating that it was my hope that the overwhelming evidence you presently have proving (inmate) Clingerman would be extremely dangerous to women and society at large if released will be sufficient now and in future hearings to keep him in prison until 2046 (maximum sentence). Yesterday, on June 3, 2025, I received a copy from the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction which shows that his Current Risk Score is (high) at 18. The same as last reported in 2021 with no improvement. Additionally, new behavioral infractions

were found since 2021, including a January 2, 2024 write-up for stealing. As previously stated, this man has proven himself time and time again to be a classic sociopath who must be restricted and confined to protect others.

Sentencing Judge Andrew D. Logan said it all in his five page Judgment Entry finding Brian Clingerman, by a clear and convincing standard of evidence, that Clingerman is a SEXUAL PREDATOR “who is likely to engage in the future in one or more sexually oriented offenses.” Please read the entire Entry attached to my letter of August 12, 2021. An important snippet of what the judge had to say regarding his chronic criminal conduct is worth giving:

- (a) The Defendant’s foray into the criminal justice system began in 1984 when the Defendant was only 14 years old. He had fifteen (15) separate appearances with the juvenile justice system including Aggravated Burglary, Burglary, Arson, CCW, Theft, Vandalism, Truancy and Parole Violations. As a result of these criminal transgressions he was ultimately sentenced to the Department of Youth Services on three (3) separate occasions, before he was ultimately discharged as an adult.
- (b) From the age of 18 to 24, the Defendant continued in his criminal ways, including committing multiple B&E’s, RSP, Arson, and Attempted Burglary, for which he was sentenced to both county jail and prison.

But above and beyond his incorrigibility and being not reformable is his depravity and sheer inhumanity shown to women he did not know and brutally raped. The facts of these episodes are chilling and beyond disgusting. His second victim was attacked with her three year old son and four year old daughter present. Please

review our October 1, 2003 letter. And to top it all off, and the scientific evidence and mountain of guilt shown against Clingerman, a female relative of this man has come forward to provide new evidence to the Parole Board that she was repeatedly assaulted and raped by Clingerman as a child. So with all of the victims together strongly opposing his release, along with his prison assessment and the very nature of his violent rapes and convictions, it seems clear to us that Clingerman is not suitable for release from prison confinement. He truly is a clear and present danger to any community at age 55! Keep him where he alone and justice put him!

Dear Ms. Handwerk:

Please be advised that I am writing you as a follow up to my October 1, 2003 letter to the Ohio Board wherein this office strongly opposed inmate Clingerman's release on parole. As the Board is aware Clingerman is a serial rapist and has a long history of other crimes and imprisonment. See previously mailed records which are itemized in attached October 1, 2003 letter. Further current institutional records show that Clingerman's Current Risk Score as High (18) (Current Institutional Report Summary dated July 7, 2021, attached). Clearly, this individual is very dangerous and at age 51 would likely reoffend if released on parole today!

Furthermore, since I sent the board a package of materials in 2003 a new court proceeding was held in Trumbull County Common Pleas for the purpose of determining the appropriate sexual offender classification for inmate Clingerman (the case was reheard after Clingerman won an appeal on the language used by the trial court stating in its first judgment entry that there is "a possibility that the Defendant would continue to commit like acts (i.e. rapes) when released."

Judge Andrew Logan who held a second hearing in this matter wrote in part the following in his second judgment entry dated February 28, 2006:

These convictions (i.e. rapes) resulted from two (2) separate, violent, sexual assaults against two (2) separate victims occurring approximately five (5) months apart in August of 1994 and January of 1995. The Defendant had been released from prison a mere 3 months prior to the first rape on May 23, 1994 after having been sentenced to a one (1) year term of incarceration for Attempted Burglary.

On August 20, 1994, the Defendant used a ladder to enter into the bedroom of the first victim, a 33-year-old divorcee who lived with her aunt. The Defendant attacked her while she slept, putting his hand over her mouth and advising her not to scream. He then digitally penetrated her and bit her breast. When the victim attempted to resist the Defendant assaulted her, striking in the face causing her nose to bleed, and hitting her about the head about five (5) times until she became disoriented. The rapist then began to choke the victim. He then forcibly turned her face down on her bed and then vaginally raped her from behind while still holding her hair, which he later used to pull her off the bed, before leaving her bloody.

On January 18, 1995, the Defendant again forcibly made enter in to the home of the second victim, a 23-year-old mother of two. She too was asleep when the Defendant likewise attacked her in

bed. The victim's 3-year-old son and 4-year-old daughter were both in the bed when the Defendant struck. He placed his hand over her mouth. When she attempted to resist, he again grabbed her by her hair and slammed her head on the bed. He then took her from her bed, into her son's bedroom. He unbuttoned her shirt, fondled her breasts, pulled down her pajama bottoms and sexually assaulted her with both his finger and his penis. He also turned her onto stomach, but he did not sodomize her. ...

The court went on in its 5-page entry in making a determination that Brian Clingerman is a sexual predator as a matter of fact and law by making the following findings of facts:

- (1) The Defendant was born on November 10, 1969 and was 23 and 24 years of age, respectively at the time of the commission of the offenses.
- (2) The Defendants' prior criminal or delinquency record is substantial, including the following:
 - (a) The Defendant's foray into the criminal justice system began in 1984 when the Defendant was only 14 years old. He had fifteen (15) separate appearances with the juvenile justice system including Aggravated Burglary, Burglary, Arson, CCW, Theft, Vandalism, Truancy and Parole Violations. As a result of these criminal transgressions he was ultimately sentenced to the Department of Youth Services on three (3) separate occasions, before he was ultimately discharged as an adult.
 - (b) From the age of 18 to 24, the Defendant continued in his criminal ways, including committing multiple B&E's, RSP, Arson, and Attempted Burglary, for which he was sentenced to both county jail and prison.

- (3) Both victims were adults at the time of the commission of the offenses. As such, the age of the victims is not an aggravating circumstance.
- (4) The offenses involved multiple victims, the two women themselves, as well as impacting upon the aunt of the first victim and the two (2) minor children of the second victim.
- (5) Drugs and alcohol were not used to impair victim.
- (6) The offender had not been previously convicted or pleaded guilty to a sexually oriented offense, although one of the juvenile adjudications reflect that the Defendant broke into a woman's apartment while she was bathing. However, since having been incarcerated for nearly ten (10) years and recommended by the institution, the Defendant has not completed any sex offender program.
- (7) Mental illness or mental disability of the Defendant is not present and was not a factor even though the Defendant claims to have received mental health counseling and has attended a mental health program while incarcerated.
- (8) The nature of the offender's sexual conduct, sexual contact and interaction in a sexual context, (entering into the residence under the cover of darkness, using a ladder to make entry, climbing into bed with the victim, caressing the victims' hair, fondling their breasts, penetrating the victims both digital and with his penis, and entering or attempting to enter from behind) was part of a demonstrated pattern of abuse.
- (9) During the commission of the sexually oriented offense, the Defendant displayed cruelty, and made one or more threats of cruelty, including hitting, beating, biting, strangling, and threatening the victims.

(10) As to provision (j) the Court finds that The Defendant, in nearly ten (10) years of incarceration has only made “a marginal adjustment”. ...

The Court per Judge Logan concluded:

“The sexual predator laws are in effect in order to protect the public from criminals such as this Defendant...

The Court finds:

1. The Defendant pleaded guilty to a sexually oriented offense, and
2. By clear and convincing evidence, the Defendant is likely to re-offend and/or is likely to engage in the future in one or more sexually oriented offenses.
(Emphasis added).

***[and] Upon evaluation of all the evidence before the Court, it is apparent by clear and convincing standard the Defendant is a sexual predator. (See complete entry of the common pleas court included).

Therefore, as prosecutor for Trumbull County, I re-emphasize our position in the 2003 letter recommending that release not be granted to inmate Clingerman... “until the expiration of his entire prison sentence is completed. To release him now would neither further the interests of justice, nor be consistent with the welfare and security of society.” Further and importantly my office has been recently contacted by a female relative of inmate Clingerman who strongly opposes his release and fears him. She is prepared to provide new evidence to the parole board that she was repeatedly assaulted and raped by Clingerman as a child. She would be available as a victim if a full board hearing were required.

It is my hope that the overwhelming evidence you presently have proving Clingerman would be extremely dangerous to women and society at large if released will be sufficient now and in future hearings to keep him in prison until 2046. He

truly is a poster person for the Sexual Predator Period! That's why he is in jail and needs to remain locked up!

Please accept this letter in behalf of the Trumbull County Prosecutor's Office adamantly opposing release/clemency for the above named convict.

Factually, the Defendant entered pleas of guilty to two (2) counts of Rape arising from two (2) separate sexual assaults was sentenced pursuant to the plea agreement to consecutive 6 to 25 year sentences for two (2) separate rapes. The State agreed to dismiss two (2) counts of Aggravated Burglary and one (1) count of kidnapping.

On August 20, 1994, the Defendant had gained entry into the first victim's house by climbing a ladder. He then attacked the victim while she slept. He assaulted her, striking in the face causing a nose bleed, and he bit her on the breast. He then forcibly turned her face down on her bed and then vaginally raped her from behind. This also caused her to sustain injuries to her neck.

Approximately five months later, on January 18, 1995 the Defendant again forcibly made enter in to the home of the second victim. She too was asleep when she was attacked in her bed. Additionally, the victim's 3 year old son and 4 year old daughter were both in the bed when the Defendant struck, placing his hand over her mouth, holding her by her hair and slamming her head on to the bed.

He then took her from her bed, into her son's bedroom. He unbuttoned her shirt, pulled down her pajama bottoms and sexually assaulted her. Her also turned her onto her stomach, but he did not sodomize her.

I have also enclosed additional materials which I believe will shed additional light on this

Defendant, and whether granting him clemency/release would further the interests of justice, and be consistent with the welfare and security of society. These material include:

1. The statement from the first victim Regina. (The victim initially believed that the rapist was a Michael Stemmock, but DNA analysis excluded Stemmock and included Clingerman.);
2. The police reports from the first victim, Regina DiCenso, including the statement from a witness, as well as, the DNA reports;
3. The medical record of the first victim, Regina DiCenso;
4. The statement of the second victim, Traci Renee Rine;
5. The police reports from the second victim, Traci Renee Rine; including the blood and DNA reports and witness statements
6. The medical records of second victim Traci Renee Rine;
7. A copy of the competency evaluation, dated November 10, 1995
8. A copy of the social history, dated October 30, 1995.
9. Docket sheets from the Defendant's other cases in Trumbull County which include;
 - A. 1987 - Breaking and Entering wherein the Defendant was sentenced to 6 months, (An arson charge was dismissed);
 - B. 1989 - 2 Counts Receiving Stolen Property, 1 Count Arson, 2 Counts Breaking and Entering wherein the Defendant was sentenced to a total of 4 years.
 - C. 1993 - Attempted Burglary, (which was reduced from Attempted Aggravated Burglary) wherein the Defendant was sentenced to 1 year.
10. Request for Sexual Predator Adjudication dated April 9, 1997;
11. Request for Sexual Predator Adjudication dated September 3, 2003;

Most interestingly, the Defendant's criminal history reflect that the Defendant is a repeat offender. Indeed he has committed many of the offenses within a very short time of being released from prison. Furthermore, the severity of the offenses continues to increase as well.

Quite simply, the Defendant is a danger to society. His previous incarcerations have neither rehabilitated nor deterred him from committing increasingly serious criminal offenses. To the contrary, he continues to escalate his criminal activities. As such, he should not be granted any release until the expiration of his entire prison sentence is completed. To release him now would neither further the interests of justice, nor be consistent with the welfare and security of society.

JUDGMENT ENTRY

This matter is again before this Court for purposes of determining the appropriate sexual offender classification of the Defendant pursuant to R.C. 2950.01 *et seq.*

The Defendant, Brian Clingerman, was indicted on or about the May term 1995 by the Trumbull County Grand Jury on Counts 1 and 4 of Rape (R.C. 2907.02 (a)(2)), Count 2 of Kidnapping (R.C. 2905.01 (a)(2)), Counts 3 and 6 of Aggravated Burglary (R.C. 2911.11 (a)(3)), Count 5 of Robbery (R.C. 2911.02). On March 12, 1996 Defendant entered a plea to Counts 1 and 4 Rape in violation of R.C. 2907.02(a) (2) and was thereafter sentenced to an indeterminate sentence of 6 to 25 years on each count to run consecutive. In exchange for the plea the State dismissed the remaining counts. The Defendant commenced serving his sentence immediately thereafter.

These convictions resulted from two (2) separate, violent, sexual assaults against two (2) separate victims occurring approximately five (5) months apart in August of 1994 and January of 1995. The Defendant had been released from prison a mere 3 months prior to the first rape on May 23, 1994 after having been sentenced to a one (1) year term of incarceration for Attempted Burglary.

On August 20, 1994, the Defendant used a ladder to enter into the bedroom of the first victim, a 33-year-old divorcee who lived with her aunt. The Defendant attacked her while she

slept, putting his hand over her mouth and advising her not to scream. He then digitally penetrated her and bit her breast. While the Defendant was in prison, the Ohio Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation notified the court that it had concluded its screening of the Defendant pursuant to HB 180, and recommended that the Defendant be classified as a sexual predator. This Court subsequently conducted a hearing on the sexual classification issue, as well as a number of other issues raised by the Defendant, none of which are now before the Court.

After the hearing, this Court concluded the Defendant was a sexual predator. However, on appeal, the Eleventh District Court of Appeals opined that this Court's determination that there is "a possibility that the Defendant would continue to commit like acts when released" did not meet the statutorily required language contained in R.C. 2950.01 (E)(1) which provides in

part "Sexual predator means a person ***[who] is likely to engage in the future in one or more sexually oriented offenses." The Eleventh District Court of Appeals in rejecting this Court's use of "alternative language" noted that a trial court is required to find that the Defendant would "likely re-offend." The matter was remanded for a new hearing on the sexual offender classification.

The Defendant was re-conveyed from his state penitentiary incarceration to the Trumbull County Jail. On February 7, 2006, the re-hearing was had, and Defendant was present with counsel. The Court again offered to provide expert assistance to the Defendant, but the Defendant again declined. The case proceeded without an expert on behalf of the Defendant. The State also elected to proceed without an expert and has relied upon the facts of this case, the Defendant's record, and materials introduced at the prior hearing as well as the submissions made during the instant hearing. The Defendant did not object to the admission of the State's materials.

This Court has reviewed this matter pursuant to the provisions of R.C. 2950.09 (C). This Defendant pleaded guilty to a sexually oriented offense prior to January 1, 1997 and was sentenced prior to January 1, 1997 and is serving a term of imprisonment in a state correctional institution.

In reviewing this matter to make a determination as to whether the Defendant is a sexual predator, the Court must review the criteria established in R.C. 2950.09 (B)(3). In addition to the foregoing facts, the Court makes the following findings of facts:

- (1) The Defendant was born on November 10, 1969 and was 23 and 24 years of age, respectively at the time of the commission of the offenses.
- (2) The Defendant's prior criminal or delinquency record is substantial, including the following:

- (a) The Defendant's foray into the criminal justice system began in 1984 when the Defendant was only 14 years old. He had fifteen (15) separate appearances with the juvenile justice system including Aggravated Burglary, Burglary, Arson, CCW, Theft, Vandalism, Truancy, and Parole Violations. As a result of these criminal transgressions he was ultimately sentenced to the Department of Youth Services on three (3) separate occasions, before he was ultimately discharged as an adult.
- (b) From the age of 18 until 24, the Defendant continued in his criminal ways, including committing multiple B & E's, RSP, Arson, and Attempted Burglary, for which he was sentenced to both county jail and prison.

- (9) During the commission of the sexually oriented offense, the Defendant displayed cruelty, and, made one or more threats of cruelty, including hitting, beating, biting, strangling, and threatening the victims.
- 10) As to provision (j) the Court finds that The Defendant, in nearly ten (10) years of incarceration has only made "a marginal adjustment."

The Court finds that the factual basis of these multiple rapes establishes premeditated and intentional acts. This Court is of the opinion that this pattern would have continued if Defendant had not been captured.

The sexual predator laws are in effect in order to protect the public from criminals such as this Defendant. The public must be protected through registration and reporting as is required pursuant to statute.

The Court finds:



Upon evaluation of all the evidence before the Court, it is apparent by a clear and convincing standard that the Defendant is a sexual predator.


