On December 28, 1992 two roaming sociopaths, Ibn Shakoor (age 23) and Roosevelt DeVail Gray (age 17), traveled by automobile from Youngstown, Ohio to Warren, Ohio to sell crack in the Fairview Gardens

residential housing area. Both had criminal histories and both were armed with firearms. Eventually, they decided to commit a random robbery and at approximately 9:30 p.m. they drove into the parking lot of Sir Bentley's Lounge on the northwest side of the City of Warren. Joseph Muscardelli (age 21) and Beverly Schofield (age 19), who was 8 months pregnant at the time, had just parked their vehicle and were going into the restaurant to eat.

However, this duo of thugs, led by the older Shakoor, had no interest in allowing a happy law-abiding couple who were minding their own business to go out to eat that night. As Joe, who was driving, and Beverly were getting ready to exit both front doors of their car, Ibn Shakoor, armed with a gun, approached Joe and Roosevelt Gray, armed with a gun, approached Beverly. Mr. Muscardelli was shot three times, robbed and killed by Shakoor while Ms. Schofield was robbed of her purse at gunpoint by Roosevelt Gray. See attached police reports and statements.

Both of these individuals were arrested and successfully prosecuted in Trumbull County in 1993. Inmate Roosevelt DeVail Gray pled guilty to Involuntary Manslaughter; Aggravated Robbery (2 counts); Receiving Stolen Property; and a 3 years Firearm Specification. He was sentenced to 18 years to 85 years in prison by former Common Pleas Court Judge Wyatt McKay. However, after a Full Board

Hearing in 2019, and following our strong objections to his release, Gray was released on parole. See attached our April 1, 2019 letter to the Parole Board Chair. Unfortunately, his release on parole Gray absconded and his parole was violated and is presently back in prison and scheduled for another release hearing in May of 2028.

In the strongest of terms the Trumbull County Prosecutor's Office views both Gray and Shakoor as habitual, dangerous criminals who have no moral compass. Inmate Shakor, the actual killer and may be branded as the "I need no reason to kill you," is most likely the most dangerous of the two in spite of mitigating evidence such as a low IQ which provided mitigating factors to a three judge panel to lessen his sentence to 30 years to life, along with a 3 year gun specification. See attached Sentencing Entry and Opinion of Court. Briefly looking at their criminal histories, egregious nature of their crimes and their prison behavior—they rival other benchmark offenders who set the examples as to why society must have prisons and life sentences.

Please review the attached Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction's Current Institutional Report Summary dated October 10, 2025 on Ibn Shakoor. His Current Risk Score is (high) at 24. He has been in prison over thirty years and has yet to complete a routine treatment program named "Cage Your Rage," and it is also most enlightening to read the many of his documented Disciplinary history and rules violations while in your custody and care. This guy is a constant

threat to prison guards and fellow prisoners. This man clearly has the classic features of Anti-Social Personality Disorder and at age 55 is never going to learn or change. Please, for the sake of society and safety of others in the future, don't release Shakoor. One Aggravated Murder is enough! More than enough! Any parole for him at his first chance for release would demean the seriousness of his crimes and unnecessarily jeopardize public safety.

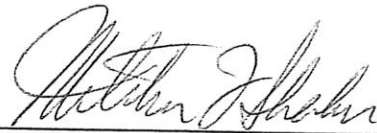

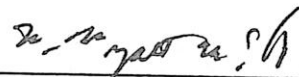

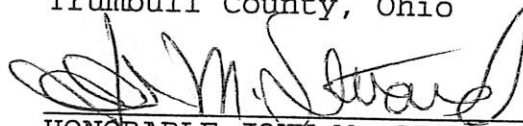

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 2929.03(F), the three-judge panel submits herein its specific findings regarding the sentencing of Defendant in this matter.

With reference to Count #1 of the indictment concerning the Aggravated Murder of Joseph Muscardeli, Defendant, Ibn A. Shakoor pleaded guilty to one aggravated circumstance: that he purposely caused the death of Joseph Muscardelli while committing or while fleeing immediately after committing Aggravated Robbery [R.C. 2929.04(A)(7)].

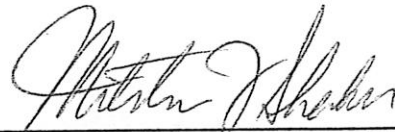
The defense did not contest nor deny the truth of the allegations contained in the State's explanation of circumstances or statement of facts given at the time of Defendant's guilty plea.

The Court considered the following factors in possible mitigation pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 2929.04(3)(4) & (5):

- 1) The low intelligence of the defendant;
- 2) The age of the defendant;
- 3) The prior criminal conviction of receiving stolen property but with no prior conviction for offenses of violence.

The State of Ohio did not rebut any evidence submitted on Defendant's behalf to establish the existence of mitigating circumstances. Further, it was stipulated that the aggravating circumstance did not outweigh the mitigating factors beyond a reasonable doubt.

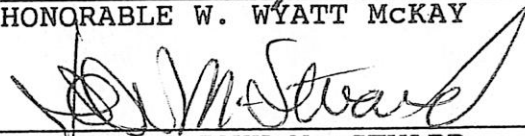

On December 28, 1992, he and his accomplice Ibn Shakoor, both armed with guns, approached victims Joseph Muscardelli and Beverly Schofield (who was 8 months pregnant) in the parking lot of a local family restaurant in Warren as they were leaving their car to have dinner. Mr. Muscardelli was shot 3 times, robbed and killed by Shakoor and Ms. Schofield was robbed of her purse at gunpoint by Roosevelt Gray. Following an investigation by the Warren City Police Department,

Gray was arrested by police on December 30, 1992 and gave a recorded statement admitting his role in the crimes. He was charged in Juvenile Court as a 17-year old and bound over to adult court and indicted on various charges including Aggravated Murder. Subsequently on January 1, 2003, Ibn Shakoor turned himself in to police.

On January 2, 1993 Shakoor was indicted on various charges including a capital offense of Aggravated Murder. On June 14, 1993, Shakoor pled guilty before a three-judge panel to the crimes of Aggravated Murder with Specification of Aggravating Circumstance; Aggravated Robbery with Firearm Specification; and Aggravated Robbery, and was sentenced to a total 33 full years to life in prison. He becomes eligible for parole in 2026.

When Gray was arrested, he told police that he did not have a gun when he robbed pregnant Beverly Schofield but he did have a gun in an earlier robbery. Also, he told officers that he and Ibn Shakoor were crack dealers going to do business before they decided to pull an armed robbery at a Warren restaurant. Eventually, Gray failed two different polygraph examinations on the gun-issue by two different polygraph examiners. Eventually he pled guilty and agreed to cooperate and be truthful with the state in the prosecution of Shakoor. Eventually he frustrated his own attorney by failing to cooperate and the judge in his case gave him a longer sentence of 18 to 85 years in prison because of his lack of cooperation.

As I stated in my prior letter of May, 2015, "Roosevelt Gray, who is only 40 years old and a proven sociopath, would be at a high risk to re-offend if released. As my material shows, Gray went from violent crime with juvenile justice intervention in Stark and Mahoning Counties, to more violent crimes including homicide in the Adult Justice system. His three county criminal history provides the best evidence for his continued incarceration."

Today Gray is only 44, and with his sociopathic personality and proven record of violence, we believe there would be a high risk to others if he would be released on parole. In short, it is better to be safe than sorry. This office fully understands that the Department of Rehabilitation and Corrections has various

mental health records which are confidential and has observed him for over 26 years and in many ways knows Gray better than we do. Furthermore, we know he was not the actual killer in this case. Thus, your current Institutional Report Summary as of March 6, 2019 Prison Re-entry Score low at 5 would give the Board reason to consider Gray for parole.

Furthermore, prison records show that Gray has been successful in many of the rehabilitative programs offered to him over the years. Also, he has only one recorded infraction of your rules since 2007. That all points to eligibility for release.

Nevertheless, this office joins the victims in opposition to Roosevelt Gray's release now because of the egregious nature of his crimes, his lengthy criminal history including violent behavior prior to going to prison, his general indifference to the rights of others, and lack of full cooperation and honesty with authorities in this matter, and most importantly, his lack of a moral compass. Long time senior Assistant Prosecutor Michael Burnett will present the State's case against parole in a power point presentation in this matter on April 17, 2019.

Most importantly, however, this office believes the sentence of 18 years to 85 years imposed by Judge Wyatt McKay reflects the seriousness of Gray's crimes and any parole at this time would demean their seriousness and unnecessarily jeopardize the public.

Dear Attorney Imbrogno:

On June 30, 1993 the Honorable Judge W. Wyatt McKay sentenced Roosevelt DeVail Gray to prison for consecutive terms for multiple violence offenses including homicide committed in Warren, Ohio. The total sentence given by Judge McKay including a three years Gun Specification was 37 to 85 years in prison. By operation of law, that sentence was reduced to 18 years to 85 years. This man therefore has served only 22 years on a maximum sentence of 85 years in prison.

Furthermore, this inmate was clearly actively involved with Ibn Shakoor in the Aggravated Murder and Aggravated Robbery of Joseph Muscardelli and the

Aggravated Robbery of Muscardelli's pregnant girlfriend, Beverly Schofield, as the couple were getting out of their car in a restaurant parking lot to go eat. In fact, Joe was shot to death (3 bullet wounds), in front of Beverly by Shakoor. Beverly was personally robbed at gun point by Gray. Sadly these evildoers had been repeatedly given second chances in the past. Enough is enough!

The Trumbull County Prosecutor's Office in 1993 recommended a plea to the multiple charges as outlined to the court in exchange for his cooperation and testimony against the trigger person, Shakoor. With his cooperation, Gray could have received a 15 to 60 year sentence. However, during the prosecution of these cases, Roosevelt Gray did not fully cooperate with authorities and was not completely truthful about what happened; thus he was sentenced by Judge McKay to a longer sentence in prison. (See materials included with this letter and my prior letters to the Board written on April 24, 2012 and November 1, 2012). Ultimately, Ibn Shakoor was convicted of Aggravated Murder and related crimes and was sentenced by a three judge panel to life in prison.

As I stated in my November 1, 2012 letter, which still holds true today ...it makes no sense under the known facts to release him (Gray) now. It would demean the seriousness of his offenses and would surely pose a danger to the community ... it is certainly not unfair to keep him to 2050." Therefore, this office recommends that Gray be denied parole in September for the longest period of time allowed under the law.

In conclusion, Roosevelt Gray, who is only 40 years old and a proven sociopath, would be at a high risk to re-offend if released. As my material shows, Gray went from violent crime with juvenile justice intervention in Stark and Mahoning Counties to more violent crime including homicide in the Adult Justice system in Trumbull County. His three county criminal history provides the best evidence for his continued incarceration.

Whether he was 15 years old and refusing to go to school or 16 or 17 years old refusing to follow the terms of his probation or just taking a small snub-nose revolver to commit a stick-up, Roosevelt Gray was going on to commit bigger and better crimes. Graduation for him was going from straight conduct disorder to anti-social disorder on a more grand scale. (See partial juvenile record included with materials attached to this letter). As I stated previously in my April 24, 2012 letter opposing any transitional control for Gray, I now more positively state (especially in light of his juvenile criminal history) that in our view the "totality of the information we know about him and his obvious anti-social personality traits that Gray would be a high risk to re-offend if released."

Judge W. Wyatt McKay of the Trumbull County Common Pleas Court sentenced this defendant to a term of imprisonment of 15 years to 85 years in prison for good reason. He has only served 19 years of the 85 year sentence he was given. It makes no sense under the known facts to release him now. It would demean the seriousness of his offenses and would surely pose a danger to the community. In short, it may be unfair to keep him in prison to the expiration of his maximum sentence in 2080, however, it is certainly not unfair to keep him to 2050. That way both Gray and Ibn Shakoor, his complicitous partner in murder and mayhem, will be together for a while. The victim and victim's family deserve no less in this matter.
