Repeat domestic violence offender gets consecutive terms

Myles Washington, 28, of McBride Street, Youngstown, was sentenced by Judge Sarah T. Kovoov of Trumbull County Common Pleas Court to 36 months in prison on Tuesday, Aug. 18, 2026,



That prison sentence will be served consecutively to an 18-month prison

term Judge Cynthia L. Westcott gave Washington on Aug. 12 for a conviction in a third-degree escape felony case.

Washington appeared in court Tuesday, Aug. 18 for a probation violation on a third-degree domestic violence felony conviction in which he received probation and a term in the Northeast Ohio Community Alternative Program from Judge Kovoov in a sentencing hearing on April 30, 2026. The domestic violence offense stemmed from a Nov. 2, 2025, incident in Warren

On May 16, 2026, Washington walked away from the NEOCAP lockup in Warren, according to Assistant Prosecutor Kevin Trapp, an offense which triggered his probation violation. Judge Kovoov, stating that Washington's criminal record -- which included two previous offenses of domestic violence -- justified the need for consecutive sentences in order to protect the public. The judge also credited Washington for already serving 287 days in jail in his latest domestic violence case.

Court records showed that Washington was convicted of domestic violence offenses in 2018 in Youngstown Municipal Court and in 2020 in Mahoning County Common Pleas Court.
